

Sister Ann Christine Pendleton, SSND *First Profession - July 31, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years*



Sister Ann Christine Pendleton is originally from Madison, Wisconsin, and in 1962 made first profession in Mequon, Wisconsin. She began her ministry in 1964, teaching at St. Stanislaus, Milwaukee for two years. She then went to Detroit where she taught at St. Anthony for one year. In 1967 she returned to Wisconsin to teach at Sacred Heart, Marshfield, and in 1969 earned a bachelor's degree in social studies education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. She became the administrator at Sacred Heart in 1970 and served in that position until 1973. After her time at Sacred Heart Sister Ann Christine taught at St. Mary, Menasha, Wisconsin, for one year and then served as administrator at St. Augustine, Milwaukee for one year. During this time she pursued master's level studies in education at Concordia College, Seward, Nebraska. Sister Ann Christine was then called to serve as coordinator of religious education at St. Ignatius, Alakanuk, Alaska, where she remained for six years. From 1981 to 1982 she participated in an intense course in pastoral studies at St. Louis University, St. Louis after which she returned to Alaska. For three years Sister Ann Christine served in pastoral ministry at Immaculate Conception and as a hospital and prison chaplain, all in Bethel, Alaska.

From 1986 to 1989 she served as parish administrator and port chaplain at St. Christopher-by-the-Sea,

Dutch Harbor, Alaska. After returning to Milwaukee, she became a certified nursing assistant and served as a home health aide and companion to seniors located in homes throughout the Milwaukee area. Since 2017 Sister Ann Christine has given her services at or through St. Camillus Health Center, Milwaukee.
