First Profession - July 31, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Ann Jerome Bisek is originally from Milwaukee and made first profession there in 1962. She began her ministry in 1964, teaching at St. Philip, Rudolph, Wisconsin, and remained there for four years. In 1968 she received a bachelor's degree in Spanish from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. That same year, she started teaching at St. Joseph, Black River Falls, Wisconsin. In 1976 she received a master's degree in education from St. Francis College, Fort Wayne, Indiana. After five years she returned to Milwaukee, teaching at St. Augustine until 1977. From the mid-1970s until 1990 she ministered in Wisconsin schools, teaching at St. Bruno, Dousman; and serving as a primary grade teacher, librarian and special needs teacher at St. Joseph, Wauwatosa. From 1990 to 1998 she was a staff member for the former Milwaukee Province. In 1998 she was missioned to Rome where she served for eight years as a general secretary at the Generalate. After returning to the United States, Sister Ann Jerome served as secretary for the former Milwaukee Province provincial council from 2007 to 2011. From 2011 to 2012 she was the executive assistant to the provincial council and from 2012 to 2014 secretary to the provincial council. She

was engaged in community service from 2014 to 2016 at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin.

Sister Ann Jerome now resides in prayer and presence at Our Lady of the Angels, Greenfield, Wisconsin.
