Sister Kathleen Donovan is originally from St. Louis and professed first vows there in 1962. In 1964 she received a bachelor's degree in art from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis and began her ministry at St. Peter and Paul, St. Louis. She taught at St. Peter and Paul for three years and then went to St. Joseph, Cairo, Illinois, where she taught for three years. From 1970 to 1972 she taught at St. Joseph, Kimmswick, Missouri, before serving six years as teacher and administrator at St. Martin, Jefferson City, Missouri. During this time Sister Kathleen received a master's degree in elementary education from Southeast Missouri State University, Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Beginning in 1978 she served for five years as administrator at St. Francis Solanus, Quincy, Illinois, and then served for seven years as teacher and coordinator of religious education at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Louis. She was administrator at St. Thomas, St. Thomas, Missouri, for six years. From 1996 to 2012 Sister Kathleen taught at St. Louis schools, including St. Margaret of Scotland, St. Cecilia School, St. Elizabeth of Scotland School, St. George, and Cathedral Grade School where she also served as administrator from 2010 to 2012. From

2012 to 2018 she was an art teacher

at Our Lady of Lourdes School, University City, Missouri, and at St. Joan of Arc, St. Louis.

Since 2017 Sister Kathleen has been serving as music coordinator at St. Martin of Tours, St. Louis.
