First Profession - July 30, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Leonette Juengst is originally from Ferguson, Missouri, and in 1962 she made first profession in St. Louis. In 1964 she received a bachelor's degree in music theory from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis. For the next 20 years Sister Leonette taught in Missouri schools, including Blessed Sacrament, Hannibal; St. Mary, Cape Girardeau; St. Lucy, St. Louis; St. Peter, St. Charles; Duchesne High School, St. Charles; Helias High School; Jefferson City; and Rosary High School, St. Louis. Beginning in 1984 she served eight years as director of the Newman Center at Lincoln University, Jefferson City. During that time she received a master's degree in pastoral studies from Loyola University, Chicago. From 1992 to 2009 Sister Leonette was a parish pastoral associate at Queen of All Saints, St. Louis. During the 2010s she served as a retreat director in St. Louis and as an outreach organizer for Metropolitan Churches United, St. Louis. Since 2013 Sister Leonette has been with Alternative Hospice, Fenton, Missouri, where she currently serves as bereavement coordinator and chaplain.
