First Profession - July 17, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Margaret Roozen was born in Mankato, Minnesota, and professed first vows there in 1962. She first ministered in Forsyth, Montana, teaching at Immaculate Conception from 1964 to 1966. For the next 15 years she ministered in Minnesota schools, teaching and serving as administrator at St. Martin, Rogers; teaching and serving as administrator at St. Paul, Comfrey; and teaching at St. Peter, Forest Lake. During this time she received a bachelor's degree in elementary education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. From 1981 to 1995 Sister Margaret served as assistant director at Sandcastle Child Care Center, St. Paul, Minnesota, and became a licensed foster parent for Ramsey County. In 1995 she moved to Cambridge, Minnesota, to develop Li'l Farm Children's Home, a home for abused and neglected children. Li'l Farm provided a home for 412 children until 2020. She also served 11 years on the Minnesota Foster Care Association Board, trained foster parents and led support groups for foster and adoptive families. Currently Sister Margaret is engaged as a volunteer at Our Lady of Good Counsel, Mankato, Minnesota, and serves on the Good Counsel Learning Center Board.
