First Profession - July 30, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Marianne Almon was born in St. Louis and made first profession there in 1962. In 1964 she received a bachelor's degree in English from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis. She began her ministry that same year, teaching at Mater Dei High School, Breese, Illinois, for one year. From 1965 to 1977 she taught at Notre Dame High School, St. Louis. During her time at Notre Dame High School, she received a master's degree in English from Creighton University, Omaha, Nebraska. She next went to St. Francis Borgia High School, Washington, Missouri, where she taught for one year. Beginning in 1978 Sister Marianne served for two years as administrator of Maria Center, Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis. She then went to the Archdiocesan Catholic Education Office, St. Louis where she served as a religious education program director for 30 years. In 1988 she received a master's degree in religious education from Loyola University, New Orleans. She continued with the Catholic Education Office from 2010 to 2017, serving as a religious education media center assistant. Currently Sister Marianne serves in prayer, presence and as a volunteer at Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis.
