A memory I have to share...

"Gifted and grateful" describe my SSND life. No matter the place or assignment, it was the inner beauty of God's love in those served that was to be nurtured. What a great experience to be part of!

Sister Mary Carol Weber was born in St. Louis, and she professed first vows there in 1962. In 1964 she received a bachelor's degree in mathematics from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis and began teaching at Notre Dame High School, Quincy, Illinois. She taught at Notre Dame High School for six years and then went to Rosary High School, St. Louis where she taught for eight years. During this time she received a master's degree in mathematics education from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. From 1978 to 1983 Sister Mary Carol was the administrator at Notre Dame High School, Cape Girardeau, Missouri, and then was selected to serve on the provincial council for the former St. Louis Province. After serving a two-year term she became program director for the Archdiocese of St. Louis in 1985 and received a master's degree in religious studies from St. Louis University, St. Louis in 1987. She remained with the Archdiocese until 1993 and then began full-time studies at Eden Theological Seminary, Webster Groves, Missouri, receiving a doctorate in theology in 1995. From the mid-1990s to the late 2010s Sister Mary Carol was an inter-diocesan and ecumenical consultant for lay ministry in St. Louis; taught at Brescia University, Owensboro, Kentucky; and

facilitated the renewal program at St. John Vianney Center for Health, Downingtown, Pennsylvania. Since 2019 Sister Mary Carol volunteers and serves in prayer and presence at Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis.
