A memory I have to share...

I appreciate everything SSND and the community have done for me. I love being a SSND.



Sister Nadine Meyer was born in Burlington, Iowa, and in 1962 professed first vows in St. Louis. That same year she earned a bachelor's degree in English from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis and began her ministry teaching at St. Martin of Tours, St. Louis. Starting in 1970 she served as administrator and teacher at Sacred Heart, Fort Madison, Iowa. During this time she received a master's degree in elementary education from the University of Central Arkansas, Conway, Arkansas. After her time at Sacred Heart, Sister Nadine taught at St. Francis Borgia, Washington, Missouri, from 1974 to 1976 and St. Peter Grade School, Jefferson City, Missouri, from 1976 to 1978. She then spent the next six years teaching at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Herrin, Illinois. In 1984 she moved to California where she taught at Santa Isabel, Los Angeles until 1985. She remained in California for the next four years, engaged in community service at Tierra del Sol Foundation, Sunland; ministering to the poor through the Diocese of San Diego; and serving as director of religious education at Mother of Sorrows, Los Angeles. Sister Nadine returned to the Midwest in 1989 to serve as parish pastoral associate at St. Cletus, La Grange, Illinois. After serving at St. Cletus for three years, she was the director of religious education at St. Mary, East Moline, Illinois, for three years. In 1995 she served for one year in adult religious education for Burlington Area Catholic Parishes, Burlington, Iowa. She remained in Iowa until 2005, serving as pastoral minister for adult faith formation for Des Moines County Catholic Parishes,

Burlington Area Catholic Parishes and West Burlington Catholic Parishes. From 2005 to 2013 she was a procurator and advocate for the Marriage Tribunal for the Diocese of Rockford in Illinois. Sister Nadine then moved to Milwaukee where she served as a driver and volunteer at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin, and as a volunteer at Riverwest Food Pantry, Milwaukee. Sister Nadine now resides at Trinity Woods, Milwaukee where she continues her volunteer ministry.
