

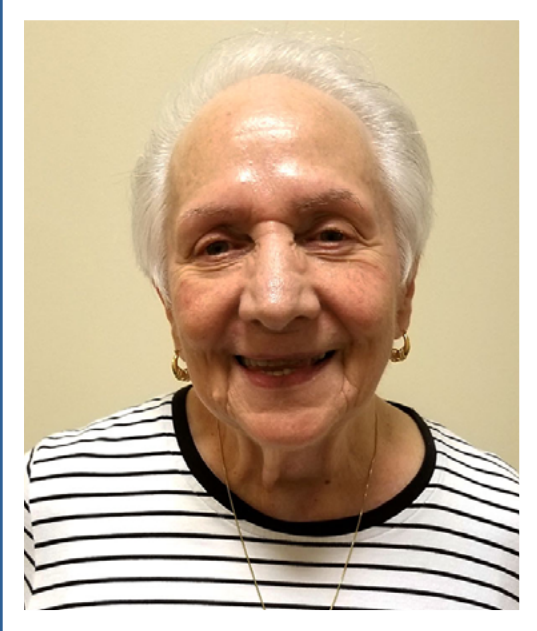

Sister Terez Gonsoulin, SSND

First Profession - July 30, 1962 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Terez Gonsoulin is originally from New Orleans and in 1962 made first profession in St. Louis. In 1963 she earned a bachelor's degree in American studies from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis. Sister Terez began her ministry in 1964, teaching at Immaculate Conception, Marrero, Louisiana. After teaching four years at Immaculate Conception, she went to St. Alphonsus, McComb, Mississippi, where she taught for one year. During the early to mid-1970s she taught in Louisiana schools, first at St. Gregory Barbarigo, Houma and then at St. Gerard Majella, Baton Rouge. Beginning in 1974 she spent the next six years as administrator at St. Gregory Nongraded School, Tyler, Texas. She earned a master's degree in elementary education administration from Xavier University, New Orleans in 1976. Sister Terez spent the 1980s teaching in Houston, including Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Carmel High School and Queen of Peace. In 1989 she moved to Mississippi where she served as administrator of early childhood education at St. Paul, Brandon. After serving at St. Paul she continued ministering in Brandon, serving as director at Circle of Friends Learning Center from 2000 to 2002 and as director at Hope Learning Center from 2002 to 2016. In 2017 she went to

the former St. Mary of the Pines, Chatawa, Mississippi, where she was engaged in community service. Since 2019 Sister Terez resides in prayer and presence at St. Anthony's Gardens, Covington, Louisiana.
