Sister Edith Juergensmeyer, SSND

First Profession - August 1, 1952 | Celebrating 70 Years



Sister Edith Juergensmeyer is originally from Koeltztown, Missouri, and in 1952 professed first vows in St. Louis. Starting that same year she taught for five years at Sacred Heart, Morrilton, Arkansas. In 1957 she received a bachelor's degree in education from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis and started teaching at St. Mary, Fort Madison, Iowa. After three years she returned to St. Louis where she was engaged in community service at Villa Gesu until 1964. She then taught for eight years at St. Paul, Highland, Illinois. From the early 1970s to the late 1980s, she taught in Missouri schools, including St. Peter Grade School, Jefferson City; Immaculate Conception, Loose Creek; and Sacred Heart, Rich Fountain. During this time, she received a master's degree in elementary education from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. Beginning in 1989 Sister Edith was engaged in volunteer services at St. Michael, Russellville, Missouri, for a time and then spent six years ministering to abused women at the Rape and Abuse Center, Jefferson City, Missouri, and five years in pastoral ministry at Sacred Heart, Rich Fountain, Missouri. In 1994 she spent the next 18 years at St. Peter's Parish, Jefferson City, Missouri, serving in pastoral ministry, as director of religious education
