Sister Gerold Mobley, SSND

First Profession - August 1, 1952 | Celebrating 70 Years



Sister Gerold Mobley is a native of Alexandria, Indiana, and in 1952 made first profession in St Louis. Her first teaching ministry took place that same year at St. Raphael, St. Louis. In 1953 she received a bachelor's degree in art from Webster College (now University), Webster Groves, Missouri. After teaching at St. Raphael, Sister Gerold taught at Rosati-Kain High School, St. Louis until 1982. During her time at Rosati-Kain, she received a master's degree in secondary education administration from St. Louis University, St. Louis and a master's degree in art from the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana. She was a student at Parson's School of Design, New York before going to Notre Dame of Maryland College (now University), Baltimore. From 1983 to 1995 she was an artist at the college, taught classes there from 1995 to 2003 and served as a graphic designer from 1995 to 2014. During that time, Sister Gerold was an art instructor at the Kennebunk Beach Program, Kennebunk Beach, Maine, and a volunteer at Villa Assumpta, Baltimore. In 2014 she returned to St. Louis where she volunteered in the art department at Notre Dame High School and at Theresa Center, Sancta Maria in Ripa. Since 2018 Sister Gerold has
