



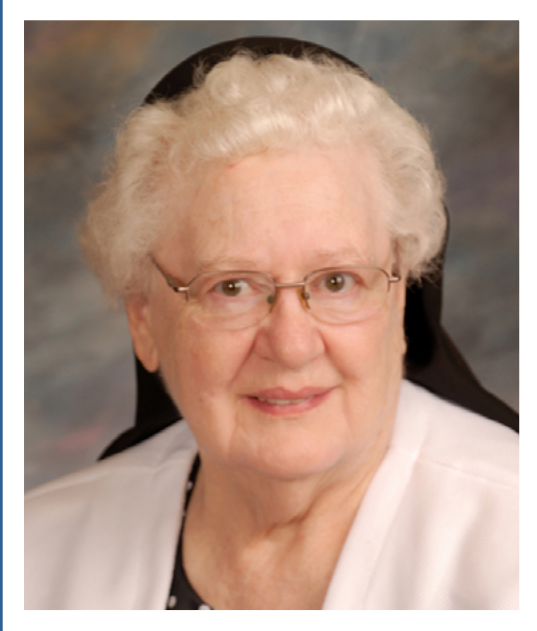

# 2022 Jubilee

## Sister Marguerite Churilla, SSND

*Formerly Georgiann*

*First Profession - July 17, 1952 | Celebrating 70 Years*



**Sister Marguerite Churilla** is originally from Minneapolis, and made first profession in Mankato, Minnesota, in 1952. That same year she began her ministry, teaching at St. Peter and Paul, Mankato. After teaching there for one year, she went to St. Matthew, St. Paul, Minnesota, where she taught until 1955. She taught at St. Peter and Paul, Blue Earth, Minnesota, from 1955 to 1958; at St. Mary, Worthington, Minnesota, from 1958 to 1960; and St. Mark, Shakopee, Minnesota, from 1960 to 1965. During this time, she earned a bachelor's degree in education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. From 1967 to 1969 Sister Marguerite returned to St. Mary, Worthington to teach and then went to St. Wenceslaus in Dickinson, North Dakota, where she remained until 1975. While at St. Wenceslaus, she earned a master's degree in elementary education from Mankato State University, Mankato, Minnesota. In the mid-1970s she spent one year as administrator at St. Martin, Rogers, Minnesota, before spending four years teaching at Holy Spirit, St. Cloud, Minnesota. Beginning in 1981 Sister Marguerite spent six years serving as a member of the clerical staff at Aria Communications while working in hospitality at St. Paul, St. Cloud. She remained at St.

Paul for 33 years. During the later part of her ministry, she served as a nursing assistant helper for the foster grandparent program and engaged in volunteer ministry at St. Paul Church/Madison School. Since 2014 Sister Marguerite has been serving in prayer and presence and as a ceramist at the ceramic haven located at Our Lady of Good Counsel, Mankato, Minnesota.
