Sister Marie LeClerc Laux, SSND

First Profession - July 31, 1947 | Celebrating 75 Years



Sister Marie LeClerc Laux was born in Menasha, Wisconsin, and in 1947 professed first vows in Milwaukee. She began her ministry in 1952 at St. Boniface, Milwaukee, serving for 19 years as a teacher and as the school's principal. She received a bachelor's degree in English from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee in 1955 and a master's degree in English from Marquette University, Milwaukee in 1964. From 1966 to 1970 Sister Marie LeClerc directed the Head Start program at St. Michael School, Milwaukee. In the 1970s she was called to the Diocese of Green Bay to serve as principal at St. Joseph's Home for Emotionally Disturbed Boys; she remained with the school for five years. She then served as a middle and high school teacher at St. Mary, Menasha, Wisconsin. She returned to Milwaukee in 1980, concluding her years as an elementary educator at Bruce-Guadalupe School. In 1986 Sister Marie LeClerc began a new ministry as curriculum coordinator for Milwaukee Achiever Literacy Services, a role she held for six years. She returned to the classroom part time in 1994, teaching at Milwaukee Area Technical College and serving as a staff member at Divine Savior/Holy Angels, Milwaukee. During the 2000s and 2010s she continued tutoring adults in literacy
