Sister Shannon Marie Scallon, SSND

First Profession - July 31, 1963 | Celebrating 60 Years



Sister Shannon Marie Scallon is a Madison, Wisconsin, native and in 1963, she made first profession in Mequon, Wisconsin. She began teaching in 1964 at St. Anne in Milwaukee, where she remained for one year. In 1965, she received a bachelor's degree in history from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee. After she received her bachelor's degree, she taught for three years at St. Peter in Beaver Dam, Wisconsin, and taught for one year at St. Vincent de Paul in Shepherd, Michigan. During the late 1960s through the early 1970s, she taught at Notre Dame High School in Milwaukee, and at St. Agnes in Butler, Wisconsin. For one year, she was a member of the clerical staff at St. Anthony Hospital, Milwaukee, and helped develop the learning program at Spectrum Alternative High School, Milwaukee. From 1973 to 1975, she taught at Messmer High School, Milwaukee, and from 1975 to 1980, she taught at Spectrum Alternative High School, Milwaukee. Beginning in 1980, Sister Shannon Marie spent the next 18 years at Mount Mary University, Milwaukee, serving as an associate in the development resources office for one year and as dean of students for 17 years. In 2000, Sister Shannon Marie served as administrator of SisterHouse, a residence for women recovering from

addiction that is sponsored by the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

She completed her ministry at SisterHouse in 2010. From 2010 to 2020, she served as a development associate and teacher at Notre Dame School of Milwaukee. Currently, Sister Shannon Marie serves in prayer and presence and lives in Milwaukee.
