SISTER ELIZABETH ANNE SWARTZ, SSND

Sister Elizabeth Anne Swartz was born in Washington, D.C., and professed first vows in 1964 in Baltimore. She taught at St. Patrick School in Cumberland, Maryland (1965-71). She studied at College of Notre Dame of Maryland (now University) in Baltimore, earning a Bachelor of Arts in elementary education in 1972. She then taught at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Washington, D.C. (1971-75). Sister Elizabeth Anne earned a Master of Arts in teaching from Trinity College (now University), Washington D.C., in 1975. Sister Elizabeth Anne then moved to Arizona, teaching middle school students in Coolidge Public Schools, Coolidge, Arizona (1975-78); before moving to Dallas, to teach elementary school at St. Elizabeth of Hungary School (1978-80). Sister Elizabeth Anne served as an administrator of elementary education at Holy Rosary School in San Antonio (1980-89); Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Glendale, Arizona (1989-95); and St. Agnes in Phoenix (1995-96). Sister Elizabeth Anne then became the associate superintendent for the Archdiocese of San Antonio (1995-96). From 1996-2017, Sister Elizabeth Anne served as Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of El Paso and Diocese of San Angelo in Texas. After a sabbatical year in 2017-2018, she worked as an educational consultant for a year. Since 2018, Sister Elizabeth Anne has been engaging in volunteer services with migrants and immigrants in El Paso, Texas.
