SISTER JEAN-ANDREW DICKMANN, SSND

Sister Jean-Andrew Dickmann was born in Port Washington, Wisconsin, and professed first vows in 1964 in Mequon, Wisconsin. That same year, she began studies at Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee. Sister Jean-Andrew began teaching in 1965, at St. John Nepomuc in Milwaukee, where she stayed for one year. She continued teaching at St. Sebastian, Bessemer, Michigan, (1966-68, 1969-76); St. Philip, Rudolph, Wisconsin, (1968-69); and Holy Angels, West Bend, Wisconsin (1976-77). While teaching, she received a Bachelor of Arts in social science, with a minor in elementary education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee, in 1972. In 1977, Sister Jean-Andrew served as a librarian at St. John Baptist School in Marshfield, Wisconsin, for four years. She then returned to the classroom as an elementary teacher at Holy Spirit in Milwaukee, (1981-82). Sister Jean-Andrew retuned to working as a librarian in 1982 for the next eight years in schools throughout Milwaukee, serving at St. Anne, (1982-85); Corpus Christi, (1985-88); Milwaukee City Schools, (1985-86); and St. Augustine (1987-88). During that time, she also served as a freelance storyteller in Milwaukee, (1988-current). Sister Jean-Andrew taught part time at Carrol College (now University), Waukesha, Wisconsin, for one year (1990-91), before returning to her role as a librarian at St. Rita, West Allis, Wisconsin (1991-2004). During that time, she earned a Master of Arts in education from St. Mary's College, in 1993. From 2004-10, she worked part-time as a librarian at Mary Queen of Saints Academy in West Allis, Wisconsin, while also continuing her ministry in storytelling in Milwaukee. Sister Jean-Andrew then served as a literacy specialist at Hmong American Peace Academy, Milwaukee, for five years (2013-17). Sister Jean-Andrew dedicated herself to literacy education and her storytelling ministry throughout her life and currently lives in prayer and presence in Milwaukee.
