Sister Joanne Armatowski was born in Milwaukee, and professed first vows in 1964 in Mequon, Wisconsin. In 1965, she was missioned to teach elementary school at Christ the King School in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin. In 1970, she received a Bachelor of Arts in sociology and history from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. While working on her degree, Sister Joanne taught at St. John Kanty School in Milwaukee (1966-70). She then spent four years teaching junior high at St. Vincent de Paul in Milwaukee (1970-74); before moving to St. Mary Czestochowa School, also in Milwaukee (1974-76). In 1977, she earned a Master of Arts in education, with a focus on reading from Cardinal Stritch University, Fox Point, Wisconsin. Sister Joanne served as an administrator of elementary education at Corpus Christi School in Milwaukee (1976-87). Sister Joanne then served on the Provincial Council in the former Milwaukee province (now Central Pacific Province) in leadership (1987-97). In 1999, she received a second master's degree from Marquette University, Milwaukee. Sister Joanne was then the Director of Pastoral Care at St. Joseph Convent in Campbellsport, Wisconsin (2000-03); before becoming the facility director there until 2005. She served again on Provincial Council in the former Milwaukee province (now Central Pacific Province) from 2005-2011. For the next seven years, she served as the Administrator at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin (2011-18). Currently, Sister Joanne lives in prayer and presence and continues to volunteer in Milwaukee.
