SISTER MARILYN SCHEIBEL, SSND

Sister Marilyn Scheibel was born in Belleville, Illinois, and professed first vows in 1964 in St. Louis. She studied at the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis, where she received a Bachelor of Arts in American studies in 1966. Sister Marilyn taught at St. Gabriel the Archangel, St. Louis (1966-69); and junior high at St. Mary, Belleville, Illinois (1969-71). She served as an administrator of elementary education at St. Paul, Highland, Illinois (1971-74); before returning to the classroom to teach at St. Dominic Savio, St. Louis (1974-78); and junior high at Notre Dame Elementary School, St. Louis (1978-79). While teaching, Sister Marilyn earned a Master of Arts in elementary education from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, Edwardsville, Illinois, in 1974. She was an administrator of elementary education at St. Augustine, Breese, Illinois (1979-85); followed by serving as an aide and teacher at St. Joseph, Freeburg, Illinois (1985). After a sabbatical in 1985-86, Sister Marilyn then taught at St. Andrew, St. Louis (1986-92); and St. Mary Magdalen, Brentwood, Missouri (1992-95). Sister Marilyn completed a Master of Education in counseling and guidance from the University of Missouri-St. Louis, St. Louis, in 1993. She worked as a guidance counselor at Franklin County Special Education Schools, St. Clair, Missouri (1995-98). Sister Marilyn then works as an education diagnostician and counselor for the Fox School District, Arnold, Missouri (1995-2007). She worked as a Psychological Examiner in Franklin County Special Education Schools through the St. Clair, Missouri Center (1995-98) and Fox School District, Arnold, Missouri (1998-2007). In 2007-2013, she became a teacher assistant for St. Louis Special School District in the Brentwood Middle School District, Brentwood, Missouri. Since 2013, has been involved in various volunteer services throughout the St. Louis area, including at the Immigrant Home English Learning Program, St. Louis, where she currently teaches citizenship classes.
