SISTER MARY PAMELA MOEHRING, SSND

Sister Mary Pamela Moehring was born in Appleton, Wisconsin, and professed first vows in 1964 in Mequon, Wisconsin. In the next 18 months she completed studies at Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee, earning a Bachelor of Science in chemistry and secondary education. She then taught for the next four years at Notre Dame High School, Milwaukee (1965-67); Caroline Academy, Mequon, Wisconsin (1967-68); and Bishop Borgess High School, Detroit, Michigan (1968-69). In 1969, Sister Pamela moved to Oklahoma to attend Oklahoma State University, Stillwater, earning a Master of Science in natural science in 1970. Upon completing her master's degree, Sister Pamela returned to Mount Mary, Milwaukee, as an instructor and then assistant professor of biology (1970-77). In 1977, Sister Pamela returned to school, this time at Oregon State University, Corvallis, Oregon, receiving a Ph.D. in radiation biology in 1980. Again, Sister Pamela returned to Mount Mary. She continued teaching biology, moving in rank from assistant professor to associate professor (1980-89) and in 1989, to professor. Sister Pamela served as dean for graduate and continuing education (1984-96); while also teaching biology part-time. After a sabbatical period (1996-1997), she completed five units of clinical pastoral education and worked as a hospital chaplain at several Madison, Wisconsin hospitals; Meriter Hospital (1997-2000); University of Wisconsin Hospitals (1999-2000); and St. Mary's Hospital (1997-present). Certification with the National Association of Catholic Chaplains has been continuous since 2000. Currently, Sister Pamela continues her ministry at SSM St. Mary's Hospital in Madison, Wisconsin.
