SISTER NANCY FLAMM, SSND

Sister Nancy Flamm was born in Anna, Illinois, and professed first vows in 1964 in St. Louis. That same year, she began studies at the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis, earning a Bachelor of Arts in American studies in 1966. Sister Nancy taught at schools in Missouri, first at Blessed Sacrament School, Hannibal, Missouri (1966-71); and then at St. Bernadette School in St. Louis (1971-75). In 1974, Sister Nancy earned a Master of Arts in elementary education from the University of Missouri-Columbia, Columbia, Missouri. Sister Nancy then moved to California and taught at St. Helen School, Fresno, California (1975-82); when she then moved back to Missouri. Upon returning to Missouri, she taught at Immaculate Conception School, Jackson, Missouri, for two years. She then spent a year as a student at the Aquinas Institute, St. Louis (1984-85). Sister Nancy spent the next six years working for the former St. Louis province (now the Central Pacific Province), serving as the director of initial formation (1985-91); director of affiliates (1985-88); and the director of vocations (1986-88). She also taught part-time at St. Martin of Tours, St. Louis (1985-86); and fulltime at Immaculate Conception, Loose Creek, Missouri (1988-89). For the next 14 years, Sister Nancy served as a pastoral associate at various Catholic Churches throughout Pulaski County, Illinois (1989-2003). In 2003, she became a community leader at Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis, until 2007. Following her role as a community leader, she became the director of religious education at the Cathedral of St. Mary, Cape Girardeau, Missouri (2007-08); for one year and then serving as a teacher aid at St. John Baptist School, St. Louis (2008-11). Sister Nancy then moved to Mississippi, and served as coordinator of pastoral care at St. Mary of the Pines, Chatawa, Mississippi (2012-18); before returning to St. Louis. Since 2018, Sister Nancy has been serving at The Sarah Community as the community coordinator assistant, Bridgeton, Missouri.
