Sister Susan Ann Adrians was born in Appleton, Wisconsin. She professed her first vows in 1964 in Mequon, Wisconsin. She has ministered as a teacher, a parish coordinator of religious education, addiction counselor, and pastoral counselor/spiritual guide. Additionally, Sister Susan Ann served the School Sisters of Notre Dame (SSND) community in leadership roles as a provincial councilor and director of novices. Her ministry locations included schools, parishes, hospitals, health care centers, hospice and communities in Wisconsin, Michigan, Missouri, Illinois and Indiana. She earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee and a master's degree in human and religious studies from St. Mary's College in Winona, Minnesota. She completed four advanced units in clinical pastoral education at the Hazelden Foundation in Center City, Minnesota, and obtained a master addiction counselor certification and earned her credentials as a licensed professional counselor. Sister Susan Ann currently serves by her prayer, presence and volunteer ministry, including individual counseling. She resides at Trinity Woods, Milwaukee.
