SISTER LUETTA WOLF, SSND

Sister Luetta Wolf was born in Vesper, Wisconsin, and professed first vows in 1954 in Milwaukee. That same year, she began studies at Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee, earning a Bachelor of Arts in English and French in 1962. Sister Luetta taught at St. Francis Xavier School, Green Bay, Wisconsin (1955-56); Holy Cross/Consolidation, Mount Calvary, Wisconsin (1956-62); West Catholic High School, Grand Rapids, Michigan (1962-66); before becoming an instructor at Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee in 1966. In 1968, Sister Luetta received a Master of Arts in English from Marquette University in Milwaukee. She went on to earn a Ph.D. in English from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, in 1972. Sister Luetta then returned to Mount Mary College (now University), where she was on the English faculty for over 35 years, until 2009. During those years, she also served as English department chair (1973-79), academic dean (1979-84), and chairperson again (1984-99). After retiring from full-time teaching in 1999, Sister Luetta continued to teach English part-time at Mount Mary until 2009. In 2009, Sister Luetta was a volunteer tutor in Franklin, Wisconsin. Since 2019, Sister Luetta has continued to volunteer and serve in prayer and presence in Milwaukee, where she currently resides.
