SISTER ROSALEEN KREBS, SSND

Sister Rosaleen Krebs was born in New England, North Dakota, and professed first vows in 1954 in Mankato, Minnesota. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in elementary education from College of St. Catherine in St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1962 and a Master of Science in elementary and social studies education from Mankato State University, Mankato, Minnesota, in 1971. Sister Rosaleen taught primary grades at several schools in Minnesota, and North Dakota, over her career. In Minnesota, she taught at Assumption School in St. Paul (1955-57), St. Andrew School in St. Paul (1968-70), Corpus Christi School in St. Paul (1971-73), and St. Michael School in Prior Lake (1970-71). In North Dakota, she taught at St. Anne School in Bismarck (1957-60), St. Wenceslaus School in Dickinson (1963-68), and St. Mary School in New England (1974-82). She also taught first grade at St. Joseph School in Grenville, South Dakota, (1960-63) and Holy Cross School in Milwaukee, Wisconsin (1973-74). From 1982-1990, Sister Rosaleen returned to her home region in Minnesota and taught primary grades at St. Peter School in Canby (1982-83) and Lonsdale-New Market-Veseli Community School in Lonsdale (1983-88). She then served in an administration role and as coordinator of community at Our Lady of Good Counsel Convent, Mankato, Minnesota (1988-96); and was a child care lead teacher at Mankato Area Catholic Schools, also in Mankato, Minnesota (1998-2002). Sister Rosaleen served as a nurse's aide at Our Lady of Good Counsel (2002-03); and school receptionist at Loyola High School, Mankato (2003-08); in Mankato, Minnesota. Currently, Sister Rosaleen is engaged in community service at Our Lady of Good Counsel, Mankato, Minnesota.
