SISTER ALICE ZACHMANN, SSND

Sister Alice Zachmann was born in Albertville, Minnesota, and professed first vows in 1949 in Mankato, Minnesota. She began her ministry teaching elementary students at St. Francis School in Buffalo, Minnesota (1949-1950); St. Stanislaus in St. Paul (1950-1953) and St. Albert School in Albertville, Minnesota (1953-1954); Sister Alice then headed to Assumption School in Cresco, Iowa (1954-1959). In 1959, Sister Alice received a Bachelor of Arts in history and English from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee. She then taught primary grades at St. Nicholas School, New Market, Minnesota (1959–63); St. Philip School, Minneapolis (1963–66); SS. Cyril and Methodius, Minneapolis (1966–68); Sacred Heart School, St. Paul (1968-69); and St. Stanislaus School, St. Paul (1969-70), where she also served in pastoral ministry, (1974-81). In 1982, she began working in human rights advocacy, serving on the Guatemala Human Rights Commission (1982-2002); and with the Torture Abolition and Survivors Support Coalition, both in Washington D.C. (2002-2010). Sister Alice then moved back to Mankato, Minnesota, serving in community service and as advocate for justice and peace at Our Lady of Good Counsel. Currently, Sister Alice is dedicating herself to prayer and presence in Shakopee, Minnesota.
