SISTER HERMAN MARIE SIEBENMORGEN, SSND

Sister Herman Marie Siebenmorgen was born in Morrison Bluff, Arkansas, and professed first vows in 1949 in St. Louis. She began teaching at St. Mary School, Keokuk, Iowa (1949-50); and then taught at St. Anthony School, Baton Rouge, Louisiana (1950-52); St. Francis Solanus School, Quincy, Illinois (1952-53); Sacred Heart School, Eureka, Missouri (1953); and St. Joseph School in East St. Louis, Illinois (1954-55). In 1956, she received a Bachelor of Arts in English and philosophy from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. Sister Herman Marie then taught junior high grades at St. Charles Borromeo School in St. Charles, Missouri (1955-57); serving as principal from 1957-1964. She earned a Master of Education from Saint Louis University, St. Louis, in 1962. Over the next several decades, Sister Herman Marie taught elementary, intermediate, and junior high students at schools in Texas, Mississippi, Louisiana and Alabama: Christ the King School, Corpus Christi, Texas (1964-65); St. Anthony School, Longview, Texas (1965-68); St. Therese School, Jackson, Mississippi (1968-70); St. Mary of the Pines, Chatawa, Mississippi (1970-71); St. Joseph School, Ponchatoula, Louisiana (1971-73); Our Lady of Lourdes School, Mobile, Alabama (1973-74); Immaculate Conception School, Laurel, Mississippi (1974-79); Annunciation School, Bogalusa, Louisiana (1979-82); St. Gabriel School, New Orleans (1982-83); Notre Dame of Dallas Special School, Dallas (1983-87); St. Mary School, Natchitoches, Louisiana (1987-90); St. Joseph School, Jeanerette, Louisiana (1990-92); and St. Mary School, Gainesville, Texas (1992-1998). She also held administrative roles in Our Lady of the Lourdes, Mobile, Alabama (1973-74); Immaculate Conception, Laurel, Mississippi (1974-79); and at St. Mary's, Gainesville, Texas (1993-94). After substitute teaching at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Dallas, from 1998-2001, Sister Herman Marie engaged in community service at St. Mary of the Pines, Chatawa, Mississippi (2001-11). She now dedicates herself to living in prayer and presence at Trinity Trace Community Care Center in Covington, Louisiana.
