SISTER ROSALYCE TINGLOF, SSND

Sister Rosalyce Tinglof was born in Milwaukee and professed first vows there in 1949. She taught at several schools in Illinois and Wisconsin: St. Michael School and St. Michael Central High School, Chicago (1947-48); Holy Cross School, Milwaukee (1949-56); and St. Elizabeth School, Milwaukee (1956-59). In 1957, Sister Rosalyce received a Bachelor of Science in education and English from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee. Sister Rosalyce continued teaching at St. Stephen School, Stevens Point, Wisconsin (1959-66); and St. Leo School, Milwaukee (1966-74). She earned a Master of Education in counseling and guidance from Marquette University in Milwaukee in 1973. After a leave of absence and time caring for parents from 1974-1978, she returned to teaching at Mary Queen of Heaven School in West Allis, Wisconsin (1978-85). Sister Rosalyce then at St. Mary School in Port Washington, Wisconsin (1985-88); and elementary students at St. Mary School in Random Lake, Wisconsin (1988-97). After retirement in 1997, Sister Rosalyce engaged in volunteer ministry in nursing homes in the Milwaukee area until 2003. She then dedicated herself to volunteer work and prayer and presence at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin, until 2021, before transitioning to serving in prayer and presence at Trinity Woods in Milwaukee.
