Sister Mary Benilda Dix

Sister Mary Benilda Dix, 93, died peacefully on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023, at Trinity Woods, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She patiently awaited full union with God.

In Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on May 27, 1929, Martin and Helen Dix welcomed their first child, Mary Magdalene. She was baptized June 2, 1929, at St. Hyacinth Parish, Milwaukee. She was the first of six children. Mary Magdalen attended grade school at St. John Kanty, Milwaukee, where she received her entire grade school education. In 6th grade, she wrote in a composition, "the shadow of religious life is haunting me." After graduation from 8th grade, Magdalen attended St. Stanislaus High School (later changed to Notre Dame High School), Milwaukee, where she had won a four-year scholarship.

Magdalen entered the postulancy on August 28, 1946, in Milwaukee. She spent one year at the motherhouse and one year at St. John Cantius in Chicago, Illinois, teaching the fourth grade. The following year, on August 10, 1948, Magdalen received the name, Mary Benilda, going by Benilda, as her preferred name, and began her year of novitiate. August 11, 1949, Sister Benilda pronounced her first vows. Her brother, who joined the Society of Mary, had his reception and profession dates during the same weeks. It kept the family moving from one ceremony to another.

Sister Benilda earned a bachelor's degree in English from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee, in 1957, and a master's degree in English in 1964, from Notre Dame University, Notre Dame, Indiana.

Sister Benilda's ministry experiences began as a primary teacher for four years at St. Casimir School in Milwaukee. In 1953, she was transferred to teaching English at Notre Dame High School in Milwaukee. After her first year there, she became the adviser of the school paper and began teaching journalism class. In 1965, Sister Benilda taught English at Holy Name Central in Escanaba, Michigan. In 1971, Sister Benilda was sent to Marinette Catholic Central High in Marinette, Wisconsin. From 1971-1975, Sister Benilda served on the provincial assembly and was elected a councilor for missions, serving Green Bay, Wisconsin, and up north to all the missions in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Sister Benilda was a councilor for a total of eight years, the last four were in Mequon, Wisconsin.

Sister Benilda wrote for 24 years on the "School Sister," a magazine for the public and donors. After her leadership position, was asked to become Director of Communications. The first "Circle" came out in 1984, and it became part of Sister Benilda's life for 20 years. Sister Benilda moved to Elm Grove, Wisconsin, at the time the provincial offices moved in 1997. She became involved in the community library and loved life at Notre Dame of Elm Grove. Sister Benilda also wrote the book, "Love Cannot Wait," which was published in 1987. She wrote about the life and charism of Blessed Theresa of Jesus Gerhardinger.
